COURSE CONTENT

Language is the foundation of all knowledge. Although people speak, read, and write every day, language is often taken for granted, yet it requires amazing cognitive abilities.

Through studying English Language at A Level, you will develop a deep knowledge and understanding of how the language works by exploring and analysing both spoken and written data. Studying how language has developed over time and changed is important in today's world of technology.

You will develop writing skills for real-world purposes, engaging creatively with topical issues relevant to language use. You will also look closely at the ways we acquire language as children and how contexts such as gender and the media have an impact on language use.

In Year 13, all students are required to complete an independent investigation into an aspect of language that particularly interests them.

This provides you with excellent preparation for higher education and furthers your own engagement with and enjoyment of the subject.

- Read widely, both fiction and non-fiction.
- Watch news media, read non-fiction print media, read articles on the internet and start asking yourself how the language used changes depending on the audience or topic.
