GOVERNMENT AND POLITICS

COURSE CONTENT

In Year 12 students study units on UK Politics and UK Government. In this they will look at the core ideologies within politics (Liberalism, Conservatism and Socialism), analysing different voting systems as well as looking at the roles of Parliament, the Prime Minister, and the judicial system. There will also be a unit on the ideology of feminism. This would be ideal for those students thinking of studying Law andalso complements the A Level History and Sociology courses.

In Year 13 students will look at a comparative study on Government and Politics of the USA. Within this they will study the US Constitution, Congress, the Presidency, the Supreme Court, US civil rights and democracy and participation. Students will be expected to critically analyse and evaluate both the UK and US systems of government.

Unit 1: UK Politics (33.3% of overall A Level)

Unit 2: UK Government (33.3% of overall A Level)

Unit 3: Comparative Politics USA (33/3% of overall A Level)
