### COURSE CONTENT

We are delighted to introduce this curriculum within our well-established department. The Cambridge Technical course offers exciting new content and topics relevant to the health and social care sector. Units include:

- Building positive relationships in health and social care
- Equality, diversity and rights in health and social care,
- Health, safety and security in health and social care
- Anatomy and physiology for health and social care.

Two further units, likely to be:

- Sexual health, reproduction, and early development stages or
- Nutrition for health

The health and social care sectors are among the largest employers and this qualification, equivalent to one A Level, supports progression to the specialised degree programmes required by the sector when taken alongside other relevant A Levels. The qualification was designed with support from a range of employers and universities.

Students will develop professional and personal skills, as well as theoretical knowledge and understanding.

Our alumni also regularly share their experience with our students.

Many students have also pursued careers in teaching.

Other students have gone onto a variety of courses such as Business, Film, Fashion and Marketing utilising the study skills they develop studying this course.

Alongside this, students have progressed to apprenticeships in relevant fields.
