He effectively puts an end to the War of the Roses, and anything you can find on Richard III and his unpopularity is useful. Henry Tudor (and subsequent Tudors) wage a massive propaganda war against the Plantagenets (House of York) but there is no doubt that Richard had alienated many of his supporters in his 2 years on the throne.




Books:


