GCSE SOCIOLOGY SUMMER PREP 2019



This booklet contains five tasks that can be completed over the summer break.

All students are required to complete the first task on feral children. You are then required to complete <u>AT LEAST</u> another two tasks, you can choose any two of the remaining four tasks.

If you wish to complete more than the required amount of tasks then this will put you in an even better position when starting lessons in September as you will have a wider range of sociological knowledge and understanding.

Outstanding learner points will be awarded to those students who complete <u>all</u> tasks.

This booklet needs to be handed in during your first Sociology lesson in September. It will then be marked and returned to you with feedback.

Feral children

A feral child is a human child who has lived isolated from human contact from a very young age, where they have little or no experience of human care, behaviour, or crucially, of human language

Oxana Malaya

Oxana Malaya (born Nov 1983) was found as an eight year old feral child living in Ukraine in 1991, having lived most of her life in the company of dogs. She picked up a number of dog like habits and found it difficult to master language. Oxana's alcoholic parents were unable to care for her. They lived in an impoverished area where there were wild dogs roaming the streets. She lived in a dog kennel behind her house where she was cared for by dogs and learned their behaviours and mannerisms. She growled, barked and crouched like a wild dog, sniffed at her food before she ate it, and was found to have acquired extremely acute senses of hearing, smell and sight.

What examples of non-human behaviour did Oxana display?
Why did she not act like a 'normal' child?
Oxana was found aged eight. Do you think she will have been able to learn how to be human?

Social class and education.

As part of the course, we are required to look at the education system in Britain today. One area of focus is the different types of schools that exist.

Sociologists are particularly concerned with the difference between comprehensive schools (schools that you don't have to pay to attend) and fee paying schools as well as looking at the fact that the majority of those students attending fee paying schools come from the highest social class background.

Your task is to pick two different schools, one comprehensive school e.g. Shenfield High School and one fee paying school e.g. Brentwood School. Look at the websites of the two different schools. What differences are there between the schools based on what you can see on the websites? For example, are there different subjects taught at each of the schools? Do students achieve better results at one school compared to the other? You must come up with at least 10 differences, list them in the space below.

Exploring the impact of age

Sociologists are interested in the impact that a person's age can have on their position in society.

Identify some of the health concerns of the individuals within the programme	How do the individuals entertain themselves and keep themselves active?
What are the positive aspects of growing older than average?	What help and support do the individuals use currently or may need in the near future?

Gender and equality in the family

In 1973, sociologists Young and Wilmott conducted a piece of research which found that the roles of husband and wife had now become far more equal. They referred to this as the 'symmetrical family'.

They argued that both husband and wife were now likely to have paid jobs as well as equally sharing housework and childcare. Couples also became more home centred and spent much of their leisure time together.

Your task is to find out if families are symmetrical in society today. You should create a questionnaire containing at least 10 questions and distribute this to as many different couples as possible. You could ask questions such as 'who does the cooking?' or 'who is responsible for childcare?' By asking these questions you should be able to get an insight into whether families appear to by symmetrical or not.

You should write a summary of your findings below explaining whether your own research agrees or disagrees with the ideas of Young and Wilmott. You should also attach a copy of your questionnaire when you had in your Prep so that we can see what questions you have asked.

Findings:	

Ethnicity and becoming a victim of crime

Ethnicity means belonging to a shared culture or tradition that is often linked to national and/or religious identity. Sociologists are interested in the way in which a person's ethnicity can shape their life. This particular task focusses on the issue of ethnicity and how your ethnic origin can have an impact when you become a victim of crime.
