Skirts	A line or pleated skirt. These will have to be a decent length (24" length, just above the knee) and considered a 'smart/tailored skirt' or they will be deemed unsuitable	Navy	No denim or corduroy <u>No tube, stretchy or tight-fitting skirts</u>

Blazer	Optional BHS logoed Blazer		

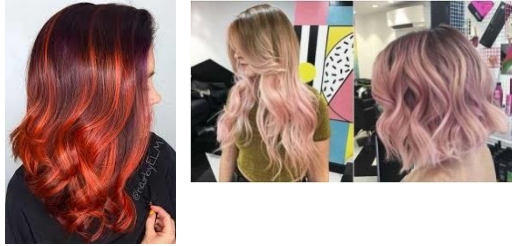
Gym kit:

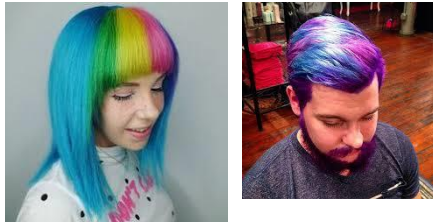
Hair colour and style and Make-up:

- Students will be allowed to enhance natural hair colour. Extreme 'all over' colours for example, blue or green, will not be permitted. We will ask students to tone the colour down if deemed extreme. As an interim measure, students may be asked to tie up their hair or cover it up. If you are unsure what is meant by extreme, please check with the Director of Key Stage 5. Headteacher's discretion will be used to decide if the colour/style is deemed extreme.
- Make-up should be light and discrete, in keeping with the uniform, as should any jewellery. If make-up is obvious, students will be asked to remove it.
- Nail polish is permitted to be worn.

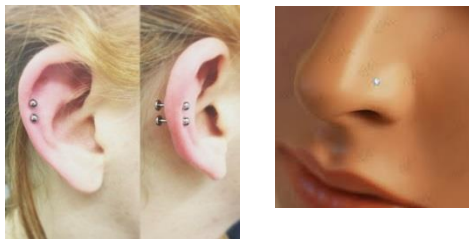

Piercings and Jewellery:

- Ears – students will be allowed 2 x piercings in each ear. These will be studs. No stretches, hoops or bars allowed.
- Facial piercings – students will be allowed one facial piercing which will be a small stud. No hoop/rings allowed. No lips piercings will be allowed. Students may be asked to remove any studs for Health and Safety reasons during lessons such as practical P.E.
- Simple jewellery can be worn which must be discreet. Students may be asked to remove any jewellery for Health and Safety reasons during lessons such as practical P.E.
