Uniform:

<u>PE KIT:</u> Students are permitted to wear their PE kit to school for the school day, when they have a PE timetabled lesson or are attending a sport activity at either lunch or after school. When PE kit is worn to school, students are not permitted to wear any items of jewellery. In accordance with the safe practice guidelines for PE, fingernails must be sufficiently short to prevent injury to self and others.

Uniform:

- Throughout the academic year, we hold 6 non-uniform days to raise funds for local and national charities. On these days, usually at the end of the term, students are permitted, if they wish to, to not wear their school uniform to school.
- If a student has a timetabled PE lesson on a non-uniform day, they must wear suitable sports non-uniform or their normal
 PE Kit so PE lessons can take place as normal.
- These rules also apply to any school event or trip when a student is not wearing the school uniform.

Permitted

Shorts, skirts, and dresses, if worn, should be of at least mid-thigh length Nail varnish

Not permitted

- Strapless or 'string-strapped' tops See-through clothing, for example see-through blouses
- Clothing, which is revealing, for example, exposing bare midriffs
- Clothing which reveals underwear
- Flip-flops or backless footwear, due to health and safety issues
- Clothing with offensive logos or text (e.g., swear words)
- The usual School rules for Jewellery, hairstyles and make-up stand for non-uniform days.

If a student fails to follow the rules for non-uniform attire, they will be provided with clothing from the school uniform shop. Repeatedly breaking these rules will lead to the student not participating in non-uniform activities.
